

Smart Tips for Finding Your Lost Cat



Your cat is missing! You're in a panic – but stay calm – most lost cats are found close to home. Follow these steps to help find your cat and don't give up!

- Scour your house by checking all small spaces, insides boxes, under furniture, in chimneys, washing machines and cupboards.
- Investigate within at least a five house radius including outbuildings, sheds, garages. Talk to your neighbours about letting you search their property.
- Alert your neighbours by posting eye catching flyers in your area mailboxes with a recent, clear image of your cat and contact information.
- Consider recent events. Have you or your neighbours renovated or moved recently? Your cat might have hitched a ride on a moving truck or be trapped in a newly constructed building.
- Search at night with a torch, when the streets are quieter and your cat's more likely to feel safe out in the open.
- Consider using tools such as humane traps containing a can of its favourite food (ask Cat Haven Ranger first).
- Contact your local council in case their ranger has picked your cat up.
- Visit local animal rescue shelters and local vets, including Cat Haven. A kind stranger may not have known your cat already has a loving home.
